


DESCRIPTION

Third generation Power MOSFETs from Vishay provide the designer with the best combination of fast switching, ruggedized device design, low on-resistance and cost-effectiveness.

The D²PAK is a surface mount power package capable of the accommodating die sizes up to HEX-4. It provides the highest power capability and the lowest possible on-resistance in any existing surface mount package. The D²PAK is suitable for high current applications because of its low internal connection resistance and can dissipate up to 2.0 W in a typical surface mount application. The through-hole version (IRFBC20L, SiHFBC20L) is available for low-profile applications.




Fig. 1 - Typical Output Characteristics, $T_C = 25\text{ }^\circ\text{C}$




Fig. 3 - Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig. 2 - Typical Output Characteristics, $T_C = 150\text{ }^\circ\text{C}$




Fig. 4 - Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature




Fig. 5 - Typical Capacitance vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig. 7 - Typical Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Fig. 6 - Typical Gate Charge vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Fig. 8 - Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig. 9 - Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Fig. 10a - Switching Time Test Circuit




Fig. 10b - Switching Time Waveforms




Fig. 11 - Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case




Fig. 12a - Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig. 12b - Unclamped Inductive Waveforms




Fig. 12c - Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current




Fig. 13a - Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current






Fig. 13b - Gate Charge Test Circuit



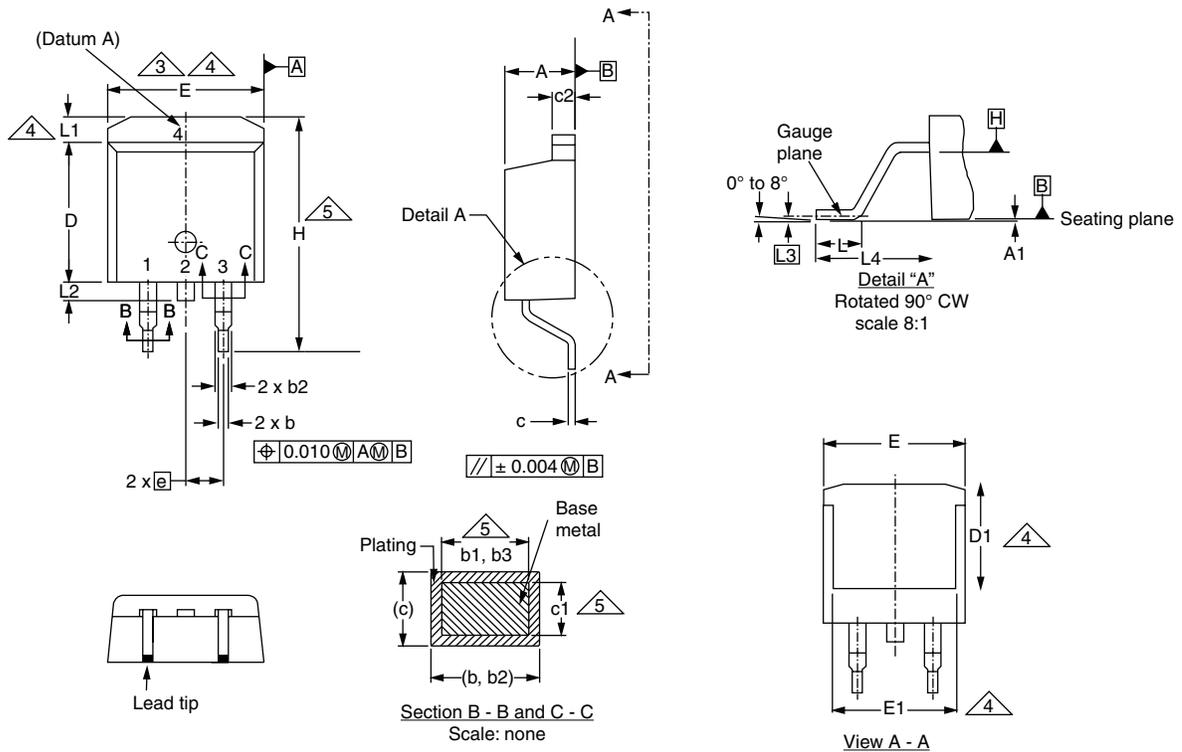




