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

Description

This device is designed primarily for low level audio and general-purpose applications with high impedance signal sources. Sourced from process 89.

Absolute Maximum Ratings(1), (2)




Figure 1. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 3. Common Drain-Source




Figure 5. Leakage Current vs. Voltage




Figure 2. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 4. Parameter Interactions




Figure 6. Output Conductance vs. Drain Current





Figure 7. Transconductance vs. Drain Current




Figure 9. Capacitance vs. Voltage





Figure 10. Power Dissipation vs.
