



- Maximum under steady state conditions is 80 °C/W



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




On-Resistance vs. Drain Current and Gate Voltage






Transfer Characteristics




Capacitance




On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature







Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage



Threshold Voltage





Single Pulse Power, Junction-to-Ambient



Safe Operating Area, Junction-to-Ambient









Note

a. The power dissipation P_D is based on T_J max. = 150 °C, using junction-to-case thermal resistance, and is more useful in settling the upper dissipation limit for cases where additional heatsinking is used. It is used to determine the current rating, when this rating falls below the package limit.
